WALKS FROM TREVENNA

Some walks start from right outside your barn door in any direction. These are two of the most popular walks.

TO THE VILLAGE PUB

Walk across the fields, along the road through the woods, over the bridge and into the beautiful village of St. Neot to the London Inn pub serving local ales and meals. Return via Tripp Hill and along the Moor with views across the valley to Trevenna. A map is available to download from our website and printed in your barn.

TO BERRY TOR, STONE AGE HUT CIRCLE

Head across the fields down towards the road in the woods, over the bridge and up towards Berry Tor. Look for the Public Foot Path sign and enter the Moors. Walk to the top of Berry Tor and enjoy stunning views across Bodmin Moor, the Loveny Valley, St. Neot village and towards Trevenna. A map is available to download from our website and in your barn.



LOCAL PLACES TO GO

ST. NEOT VILLAGE

Visit St. Neot village for the local shop, London Inn Pub, Village Green Garden and famous Medieval stained glass windows in the Church. The village of St. Neot village was awarded, 'Best Village of the Decade in 2006'.

WALKS NEAR TREVENNA

GOLITHA FALLS

River side walk along the upper part of the River Fowey where granite stones form the famous tumbling Golitha Falls which run through ancient woodland.

LOOE via TALLAND to POLPERRO along the SOUTH COAST FOOT PATH

Park at Hannafore Beach in Looe and take the South Coast Foot Path, heading towards to Polperro. Enjoy secluded coves, beaches and cliff top views.



Cornwall's highest Peak, 'Brown Willy via Rough Tor'

Head towards to Camelford, then look for signs to Rough Tor. Park in the Car Park head up Rough Tor and then on to Brown Willy, where on a clear day you can see both coasts of Cornwall.

TIPS ON VISITING PADSTOW

GETTING TO PADSTOW

CAR - From Trevena, head towards Bodmin on the A38. Drive through Bodmin and follow signs for Wadebridge, and then on to Padstow. During peak periods, you may need to park & ride.

FERRY - Avoid the traffic by using the passenger ferry across the River Camel, which departs from Rock and arrives in Padstow Harbour. Look for signs to Rock, as you drive by Wadebridge.

BIKE - Park up and hire a bike in Wadebridge and ride along the flat & beautiful Camel Trail (the old railway) straight into the centre of Padstow. www.bridgecyclehire.co.uk

NORTH COAST

Rock, 22 miles

Estuary side village with cafe and clothing shop. Catch the passenger ferry to Padstow. Walk to Polzeath.

Polzeath, 23 miles

One of Cornwall's best surfing beaches, surf board hire & lessons. Cafes and beach shops

Port Issac, 23 miles

Location of the TV show, Dr Martin.

Boscastle, 28 miles

Famous fishing village with stunning harbour and restored buildings.



SOUTH COAST

Fowey, 18 miles

Yachting & fishing town with beautiful views across the river and out to sea. Plenty of restaurants and cafes, clothing shops.

Looe, 13 miles

Working fishing port with 1970's style arcades, fish & chip shops, plenty of holiday shops. Boat trips, fishing trips, crabbing from the key and a beach at the end of the town. Take the train from the Liskeard for a beautiful journey along the West Looe River.

Polperro, 13 miles

Famous fishing village of white cottages perched on steep hills leading down to a small harbour with pubs & shops.

Talland Bay, 13 miles

Secluded pebble bay on the coast path between Looe and Polperro with a beach cafe open in the summer. Ideal for snorkeling.



BODMIN MOOR

Minions, Cheesering & the Hurlers 7 miles

Cornwall's highest village with pub and shop. Walk past the Hurlers (stone circles) and up to the famous Cheesering balancing granite boulders.

Dozmary Pool & Jamaica Inn, 7 miles

Dozmary Pool, home of the Lady of the Lake from King Arthur's time. Cornwall's legendary coaching house which was immortalised in Daphne du Maurier's novel of the same name, has stood high on Bodmin Moor for over four centuries. Now a tourist service station. www.jamaicainn.co.uk

Caradon Hill, 8 miles

Cornish Tin Miners changed the world, see where it all started at the World Heritage Sites across Cornwall and at Caradon Hill, near Liskeard.

Prideaux Place, near Padstow, 24 miles

5 Rosamunde Pilcher films have been shot at Prideaux Place. "Coming Home", "Cliffs of Love", "The End of Summer", "The long Road to Happiness" and in 2005 "Magic Night".

Mevagissey, 20 miles

The famous Lost Gardens of Heligan, the biggest garden restoration project ever undertaken in Europe. Location for "Time of Perception".

Fowey, 16 miles

Historic seafaring town and home to writer Daphne du Maurier, and location for "Carousel".

Polperro, 12 miles

The pretty town of Polperro hosted some of the filming for "Carousel".

Looe, 12 miles

"Carousel" was filmed here. The beauty of the place contributed also to "Paradise of Dreams".

Mount Edgcumbe, 19 miles

When the actors Gabi Dohm and Friedrich von Thun drink tea on the grass in front of a stately mansion in "Miss Cameron" this is Mount Edgcumbe. It also features in "Paradise of Dreams".
